### FOREST SCHOOL NEWS



## **Minisoccer @ Charlestown Youth FC**

Every Saturday morning, 9-10am. Nanphysick, PL267DU or PL267DT up until May 20<sup>th</sup>. From the 27<sup>th</sup> May until June 24<sup>th</sup>, the sessions will be held on St Mewan School Field whilst work is done at the club.

Free for first time then £3 per session. Register and payment to be done @ the catering van by the clubhouse. Trainers/Boots that are suitable for grass are needed. All players need shin pads. Sessions are for children aged 4-6 years old with players of any ability welcome. Children are grouped into either foundation or progression at the start of the session if it is their first time (see about section for more details on these groups). Both groups will be on the main grass pitch from now on and may be joined together if needed due to the number of coaches that are available.

Both groups are run by FA qualified coaches with lots of experience working with younger children. We aim to make the sessions fun and accessible for everyone whilst also improving the children's fundamental footballing skills and basic understanding of the game.
